


WASH Program

We delivered hope to residents in the form of water.

Team&Team offers WASH support to the areas most in need, in the most appropriate form, by working with various parties such as local NGOs, the Korean government, UN organizations, and businesses. According to the UN, 1 dollar spent on clean water and hygiene facilities generates 9-fold economic returns. We provided water supplies and hygiene facilities and increased awareness of sanitized environments, contributing to residents' health, increased income, and a positive attitude towards training participation.

People with clean drinking water : 8,399

Prolonged droughts, which dried up the river entirely, made residents in Tana River County suffer from water and food shortage. It was challenging to gain access to clean water before the droughts, but it is now nearly impossible to gain water itself, including dirty water, as streams and rivers are dried up.

To resolve the drought issue in Tana River County, Team&Team cooperated with the local government to rehabilitate pumps and drill boreholes in villages whose existing fountains cannot provide clean water anymore due to obsolete facilities.





Kenya, Kilifi County

Benefited residents : **1,164** (130 households, 1 school)

Thanks to love from those who participated in Good Water Campaign 2017, we were able to deliver the gift of clean water to Maya village in Kilifi County. Residents of Maya village had to either use water in puddles or purchase drinking water at high costs from a neighboring village 4.5km away. The water supply was facing an imminent threat, but drilling boreholes was not feasible due to the village's proximity to the Indian Ocean, with high concentrations of salinity in the water.

Team&Team considered other options to provide drinking water, and came up with installing 7 rain harvesting systems that would leverage the local climate conditions of the rainy season. We also provided toilet facilities for an enhanced hygienic environment.

Uganda

Team&Team Uganda, now a registered NGO in Uganda, launched a WASH program to provide safe water and an improved hygienic environment. Team&Team Uganda conducted new borehole drilling around areas suffering water shortage, and focused on training local experts with the help of Korean and Kenyan water development experts.

Team&Team provides aid regarding drinking water and hygiene so that refugee-accepting local communities as well as refugees can equally sustain life. We ran programs in Kalobeyei middle/high school to promote a hygienic environment and raise awareness in 2017, following 2016.

Our efforts were not limited to basic water supply and hygiene facility support. For female students to gain a better understanding of menstruation, we carried out lectures on hygienic menstruation and distributed cotton sanitary pad kits. Safe sex and hygiene education offered by us created an environment in which female students can break down menstruation-related superstitions and discuss it at will.

In our WASH DAY campaign in which all students participated, we arranged various activities such as a drawing competition and painting the outside wall of toilets so that students become interested in personal and public hygiene and manage their schools cleanly.





Sierra Leone, Port Loko & Kambia District

Completed Water Supply System : 1
 Completed drilled boreholes : 7

Port Loko and Kambia in 2012 ranked 2nd and 3rd respectively in terms of death toll from cholera outbreak, demonstrating their vulnerability in terms of water sanitation and hygiene. Also, the rate of access to safe drinking water measures only 25%, as there is a shortage of drinking water and hygiene facilities available, with high exposure to waterborne epidemics.

To develop new boreholes and manage water quality constantly, Team&Team organized a Water Committee, conducted basic training for pump maintenance, and gave lectures on sanitation and hygiene to prevent waterborne epidemics.

Residents were once reluctant to approach training on facility maintenance, sanitation and hygiene due to high rates of illiteracy, but our staff in the field constantly put a great deal of effort into communicating with them, subsequently leading them to actively participate in activities.



Emergency Relief Program

Team&Team goes to areas in need of emergency relief and conducts the most effective method of relief response in the field of WASH.

Hygiene and sanitation are the most urgent priorities in areas affected by war and natural disaster. Ensuring access to safe drinking water is the first step to manage public health. We conduct emergency relief in the fields of water supply, sanitation, and hygiene to prevent the spread of epidemics and cure victims.

Emergency relief in response to Sierra Leone flood and landslide

Emergency relief area : **the vicinity of Freetown, Western Rural**

Benefited victims after 1st response : **3,000** (600 households)

Team&Team began emergency relief in August, 2017 in response to a landslide that victimized a total of 5,950 people.

In the 1st response, we focused on thorough management of hygiene in shelters for victims to prevent waterborne epidemics that could have broken out from prolonged rain. We provided hygiene kits that contained laundry basins, detergents, soaps, sanitary pads, and mosquito nets to enhance personal hygiene for victims.

In the 2nd response, we, in collaboration with Globalcare, an international medical relief organization, provided drinking facilities in victims' new residential areas. We installed photovoltaic water pumps, which can be used by approximately 600 people, for victims to have an easy access to safe, clean water.



WASH emergency relief in preparation for the outbreak of cholera in Kenya's UNHCR Nadapal transit center

UNHCR Nadapal refugee transit center, located along the border between the Republic of South Sudan and Kenya, is a temporary shelter for refugees through which refugees fleeing from civil war in South Sudan to Kenya should pass to enter the refugee camps. With the rapid spread of cholera in South Sudan, it was highly likely that refugees fleeing to Nadapal could spread the disease and unhygienic conditions at the center could contribute to such outbreak too, leading to UNHCR requesting emergency relief.

To prevent cholera outbreak within the center, Team&Team dispatched emergency water tanks to provide safe drinking water to refugees. We also installed toilets and handwashing facilities, and completed borehole drilling to provide constant stream of water, setting up safe, hygienic environments. Such efforts blocked the possible route of a primary infection, preventing Kakuma and Kalobeyei Refugee Camp from falling victim to cholera outbreak.





Community Capacity Building

We supported residents' dreams through the power of education.

Team&Team supports residents to perceive local issues and build the capacity to resolve them on their own. We promote residents to become the primary agents of the projects so as to build a healthy life style and develop a sustainable local community.

Our WASH capacity improvement project, a long-term community capacity building project, aims to train locals to resolve various local issues, i.e. drinking clean water and maintaining good hygiene on their own by encouraging their will and developing capacity.

We conducted basic trainings in 10 villages, and conducted advanced trainings in another 10 villages in Tana River County, Kenya. Locals took part in advanced trainings through which they learned how to improve environments around the pumps, which could easily get dirty. We planted trees to prevent erosion around the pumps, and installed benches where locals can rest while waiting for their turn to use the pump. Fountains used to be for drinking purposes only, but after providing improvement activities, the site began to serve as a point of interaction for community members.

In the meantime, neighboring villages constantly asked trained villages, which had completed their WASH campaign training, to share their knowledge on WASH and pump rehabilitation skills, so some trainees shared the skills and knowledge with nearby villages. We expect ties among villages to grow firmer in the future, and that they will build capacity on their own through community spirit.





Humanitarian Aid Program

We assured the fundamental rights of refugees by providing safe drinking water and building up sanitary, hygienic environments.

Water is a fundamental right, and serves to uphold human dignity. By providing safe drinking water, essential to sustain human life, and building up sanitary, hygienic environments, we help to normalize the residents' lives in the field of WASH (Water Supply, Sanitation & Hygiene)



As an official partner of the UNHCR (UN Refugee Agency) since 2014, Team&Team has been building up water supply systems within Kakuma Refugee Camp and Kalobeyei Refugee Camp, Turkana County, Kenya. With water supply systems in place, the WHO (World Health Organization) recommendation of 20 liters of water per person per day can be fulfilled in the improved camp conditions.

Even though hygienic facilities were built in 2017 as a response to cholera outbreak in the Kalobeyei refugee registration center, there were concerns about the management of facilities due to a lack of manpower in the peak of influx of new refugees. To resolve such issues, we selected some of the refugees from the neighboring Kakuma refugee camp and trained them to be able to manage the facilities and give instruction about correct usage and basic hygiene practices. They became hygiene promoters by themselves and promoted trainings on correct toilet usage in the center, and to wash hands the correct way.



Campaign & Participation

It was the participation of a number of donors and supporters which made it possible to provide water to areas in need across the globe. We share Team&Team's major campaigns and sharing activities for the year of 2017.



Special fundraising in commemoration of World Water Day, with Solace Soap delivering life from pure water and consolation

Residents of Turkana County, Kenya, are not guaranteed fundamental right to life in their poor residential environments. Humanitarian aid for residents who have suffered from damaging droughts is urgently called for, but this call has been neglected within the field of international aid and protection.

In commemoration of World Water Day, March 22nd, we launched 'Solace Soap' fundraising to provide clean water and support hygienically improved conditions of dwellings for students from Kalobeyei middle/high school.



The Good Water Concert Blooming Africa

The Good Water Concert is Team&Team's signature charity concert to raise donations, the full amount of which will be spent providing drinking water in Africa. With Saxophonist Gwang-sig Park, live performing bands, and audiences, we enjoyed this moment of appreciating the meaning of sharing.

The Good Water Concert 2017 was actually able to contribute more than the previous year, largely thanks to our sponsor TJ Media's decision to donate an additional amount matching that of the ticket sales. Proceeds from the concert were spent for pump rehabilitation activities in Tana River County, Kenya, and for Sierra Leone emergency relief.



Goyang International Flower Festival in Collaboration with Teraria


Team&Team, in collaboration with Teraria, participated in the Goyang International Flower Festival held in Lake park, Goyang-si. We organized quiz sessions and waterborne epidemic prevention game for audiences to raise awareness of the challenges African children face when securing water and of the importance of clean drinking water. Also, sales of air cleaning plant Scandiamoss, prepared to promote our message of delivering clean water, drew a great response from audiences, leading to the raising of funds which were used for Sierra Leone emergency relief.



Team&Team International Supporters' Night

On November 23, the Team & Team International Supporters' Night was held in order to look back at the footsteps of Team & Team International over the last 18 years and thank the supporters who have been with us along the journey.

We held a session to talk about our past programs and changes since made with the executive director Yong-joo Lee and Kenyan representative Samwel. Our honorary ambassador Ji-hye Han, an actress, also participated in the event in the form of a mini talk show, and Solnamoo Song, a flutist, shared his talent through performances, sending the power of the love of those who want to do good.



The Good Water Campaign, Your Love Fills Africa with Happiness

Vumbwe village is one of villages in Tana River County, Kenya, that suffer from the prolonged droughts in East Africa. Residents participated in Team&Team's WASH capacity improvement program, through which they build capacity to resolve drinking water, sanitation and hygiene issues on their own without external aid, and are learning to overcome challenges. Team&Team presented, as a 2017 campaign reward, The Good Water Diary, which contains secrets for happiness learned from Vumbwe residents who never lost their smiles and composure even during hardships. It drew approximately 3,400 people's participation via Naver Happybean funding, and proceeds therefrom will be spent on WASH capacity improvement activities for residents in Tana River country, Kenya, including Vumbwe village.
