## In the year 2016,

The effort and the hard work by United Nations and international relief organizations led to the end of Ebola epidemic in Sierra Leone. Yet, a continuous work is needed in improving health and hygiene conditions of Sierra Leoneans by developing the water supply facilities in schools, public health centers, and local communities to prevent the resurgence of the epidemics.

In late 2016, our emergency relief team that has been stationed in Sierra Leone for more than two years, flew to the north of Uganda to assist South Sudanese refugees who escaped from the civil war. Due to the worsening conditions of the civil war in South Sudan, six hundred thousand refugees are placed near the border of Uganda, while the UN fears the refugee population will soon surpass seven hundred thousand.

To make the matters worse, a new Ebola patient was recently found in Democratic Republic of Congo, while a patient with similar symptoms was found in a refugee camp in Uganda. The Democratic Republic of Congo and Uganda share a long border that makes difficult to prevent the movement of the people across the border.

If epidemics such as Ebola or Cholera hits a refugee settlement of a poor condition that lacks food, water, and sanitary facilities, the result could be catastrophic. For that, Team&Team Uganda has started its relief activities and is on standby in case of any further emergency.

It is said that human fate is given by the sky, but if no one reaches out a hand to the ones who are suffering, the world would become an even more miserable place. I'd like to express sincere gratitude to our many supporters, and to our partners, staff, volunteers and campaigners this year. Your support is the heart and the engine that keeps us moving and without them, none of this amazing work would be possible. I promise another profounding year that transforms the lives of the many. I hope you continue to join us on this amazing journey.





# 3,847

3,847 supporters came together so that drinking clean water and practicing proper hygiene habit become a fundamental aspect of people's daily lives.



# 33

33 Korean children got together and each raised 30,000won every month for a year to successfully build a water pump for the Kaloleni village in Kenya.

# 1,228

1,228 victims of Ecuador's earthquake were provided with basic sanitary measures such as portable toilets, water tanks and other sanitary provisions with the purpose of preventing the spread of possible epidemics.



# 412,826

412,826 residents of Port Loko and Kambia in Sierra Leone were provided with clean water and improved hygiene environment conditions.





4 large-scale groundwater boreholes were developed in the UNHCR Kalobeyei Refugee Camp, where there was no existing drinking water infrastructure. Today, the new infrastructure can provide 15 liters of drinking water per day for each refugee.

## Water Development Program

# 429,304

Numbers of locals who were provided with access to drinking water



Around the world, there are 844 million people who do not have the access to clean water, and nearly half of the population live in sub-Saharan Africa. The lack of infrastructure in remote areas of sub-Saharan Africa makes residents more difficult to secure clean water source. Therefore, 44% of the population has no choice but to use surface water sources for drinking such as rivers, ponds, hand operated wells, etc.

We provide clean and safe drinking water to the residents, improving health, education, and opportunity – especially for women and children. Bringing clean water to people looks different in each region; we provide water solutions such as borehole drilling and pump rehabilitation while taking into consideration the local culture and the environment.

## Tana River County, Kenya

### Borehole Drilling

Completed drilled boreholes : 33

People with clean drinking water : 6,159

### Rehabilitation

Number of repaired pumps : 27

People with clean drinking water : 10,119

Due to the recent weather phenomenon of El Niño in East Africa, the Tana River region, where the Team&Team field office is located, has been too suffering from the worst drought in recent history. Although dispute over ownership of the water source among the villages had been frequent due to the low precipitation, the development of water pumps has eased the conflicts.



## Turkana County, Kenya

Outcome : **The installment of solar water supply and drinking water storage**

Benefited students : **200**

The Turkana are a Nilotic people native to the Turkana District in the northwest of Kenya before the construction of the refugee camp. Currently exposed to chronic droughts and poor sanitary conditions, the Turkana are in urgent need of humanitarian assistance. However, the international efforts on host communities are relatively less focused than that of the war refugees.

We not only provide assistance to the refugees in the camp but, support the host communities by improving water accessibility and personal hygiene. In 2016, we have successfully installed a drinking water storage tank and a solar water supply system in a secondary school in Turkana. The school has an access to drinking water for the students, meaning that the students are now safe from waterborne disease and are able to study in a safer environment.



## Port Loko District & Kambia District, Sierra Leone

Number of residents that received clean water and improved hygiene environment : **412,826**

**9%** increase in access to water in Port Loko & Kambia

**13.5%** decrease in borehole fatigue

Sierra Leone is one of the countries that was most harmed by Ebola and is currently vulnerable to epidemics due to the overall lack of infrastructure in sanitation and drinking water. In Sierra Leone, only 2 out of 10 people have bathrooms in their homes. In addition, most of the people do not have access to tap water, instead, they fetch water from near ponds and rivers.

As an official partner of KOICA (Korea International Cooperation Agency), Team&Team Sierra Leone has conducted the Post-Ebola Restoration of Water Supply Project for the prevention of reappearance of Ebola in Sierra Leone by providing clean water and promoting health and hygienic environment. Starting with Ebola treatment centers where drinking water infrastructure is absent, Team&Team has worked on water development, basic health and hygiene campaign and training of maintenance of water facilities in remote areas of Sierra Leone.



Community Capacity Building Program

4,419

Numbers of residents who underwent a change



Climate change has caused the worst drought in 60 years in Africa, which caused 13 million people to face a humanitarian crisis. The condition is predicted to continue or worsen in near future, driving residents of East Africa to suffer even harsher humanitarian crisis including severe malnutrition and unsanitary conditions.

What resident needs in order to overcome these conditions is the capacity and necessary skills to confront the recurrence of a similar crisis. Team&Team supports the residents to prepare themselves for disasters and to build self-reliance so that no outside help is needed.

## WASH Capacity Building Project

Region : **Tana River County**

Number of locals who have completed basic training : **165**

Number of locals who have completed advanced training : **10**

Number of locals who benefited from the trainees : **4,244**

Team&Team's WASH Capacity Building Project is a long-term community development program that supports the resident to address the water and sanitation related problems in their own village and to build capacity to solve them.

In Tana River County, Kenya, basic training in 12 villages and advanced training in 5 villages have been completed. The basic training consists of theatrical studies and practical training of pump rehabilitation, borehole drilling, toilet construction and etc.

In advance training, trainees from the basic training become the representative facilitators in his or her village, providing the foundation for various capacity building training and workshops for the residents. This activity includes building a water pump shelter, planting trees using waterway and making hand soaps.



Humanitarian Aid Program

Team&Team believes that everyone has the right to life under any circumstances and that the most basic element to assure this right is the access to clean drinking water and to practice good personal hygiene. Through those beliefs, we respond to disputes, sickness and natural disasters around the world. We carry out water development and hygiene support activities concentrating in areas that face a chronic humanitarian crisis in Africa.

## Humanitarian Assistance in Kalobeyei Refugee Camp, Kenya

Region : **Kalobeyei Refugee Camp, Turkana County**

Number of large-scaled borehole drilling completed : **4**

Number of refugees who can now access to clean water : **60,000**

Kenya UNHCR Kalobeyei refugee camp was established in 2016 to address the overcrowding problem of UNHCR Kakuma refugee camp, which was established to support the Sudanese civil war refugees. In less than half a year since the open of the camp, the refugee population has expanded in rapid speed to 20,000 newcomers. The refugees of Kalobeyei are suffering due to lack of water infrastructure in the newly constructed camp.

As an official partner of the UNHCR (UN Refugee Agency), Team&Team has developed underground water infrastructure so that refugees of Kalobeyei can live in an environment that guarantees their basic human rights. With the support of Team&Team, refugees in the camp are now able to get clean and safe water at a closer distance.





## Emergency Relief Program

# 1,348

Number of benefited refugees

Hygiene and sanitation are the most urgent priority in the war and natural disaster-affected area. Ensuring the access to safe drinking water is the first step to manage public health. However, the area that lacks basic social infrastructure has the higher chance that it will suffer from natural disasters.

[Team&Team goes to the most marginalized areas suffering natural disasters and conducts the most effective way of emergency relief response in the field of WASH \(Water supply, Sanitation, and Hygiene promotion\).](#)

Responding to the disaster based on our 17 years of experience in the field, we focus on supplying water and preventing the spread of disease epidemic through hygiene/sanitation treatment and promotion.

## Ecuador's Emergency Relief

Region : **Manabi province, Manta & Pedernales**

Number of victims who benefited : **1,228** (8 unofficial shelters : 333 households)

In April 2016, Team&Team began an initial emergency relief in Ecuador, devastated by a 7.8 magnitude earthquake. Among the refugees, the efforts were concentrated to assist the victims who were in unofficial shelters due to their geographical conditions and lack of support from international agencies. After the earthquake, due to the repeated aftershocks and poor hygiene environment, the victims were living in conditions that were exposure to vector-borne diseases such as Zika virus epidemic. Together with Global Care, a medical relief NGO, we contributed to improving the health of the victims by providing portable restrooms, household water tanks, and distributing sanitary goods, which are the most basic measures to prevent the spread of infectious diseases.



## Follow-up Project of Nepal's Emergency Relief

Region : **Tansen, Palpa District**

Number of benefitted school **2** (120 students)

After the 7.8 earthquake response in Nepal in April 2015, Team&Team has provided health and hygiene education and distributed sanitary goods to the children affected by the earthquake along with Global Care, a medical relief NGO. 120 elementary school students were given health hygiene education that included puppet shows and correct tooth brushing lessons, along with the distribution of hygiene kits that includes toothbrushes, toothpaste, and soap.



# Campaign & Participation

Throughout the year, we made positive changes in the global community through various public fundraising and campaigns. We believe that the support from our donors and volunteers are a driving force in transforming the world.

## World's Water Day Special Campaign 'Pump Man Returns'

So that the residents can maintain their water source sustainably, we provide training that involves repairing and managing broken pumps without the outsider's help.



If the water pump that provides clean water fails, the residents have no choice but to use the dirty water source such as the river or seek external help to get the pump repaired. In 2016, 50 pump men (pump repair experts) in 12 villages of the Tana River area of Kenya were trained. Thanks to the pump men, the villages are now provided with clean water 24/7.

## World Refugee Day Campaign

In 20th of June, The World Refugee Day, a campaign was launched with the purpose of spreading awareness on how drinking water and sanitation affects the lives of the refugees.



The 2016 World Refugee Day campaign was conducted under the theme of "Support the refugees who dream of having an ordinary life" and introduced the stories of refugees who regained their daily lives through clean water in the camp. In addition, SNS handwriting event was held with Han Ji-Hye honorary ambassador encouraging others to participate in the campaign.

## My Child Share Water Campaign

My Child Share Water Campaign is a special fundraising program with 33 children become sponsors to bring a water pump to a water-scarce village in Africa.



33 children in Korea donated 30,000 won every month for a whole year to provide clean water for a village in Africa. In 2016, the second project of the campaign provided a water pump for 240 people of Kaloleni in Kenya, benefiting around 40 households.

"I did not realize that there were so many people in Africa suffering due to the lack of water before I participated the campaign. It was a very rewarding time for me to be able to help out Kenyan children for a year. Through the continuous donation, I would like to become a person who has a big heart for others, not just a person who only cares for itself."

## The Good Water Campaign

We sell a Team&Team brand merchandise for the holiday season to provide support for the children who does not have the access to clean water. The profits from the goods directly fund clean water projects.



The year 2016 campaign was conducted through Naver's Happy Bean Crowded Funding and was completed with a big success because it achieved 10 times the targeted fund and more than 1,400 people participated the campaign. The merchandise for 2016 campaign was the 2017 planner, specially designed with the collaboration of Mtree, an NGO that connects young professionals together in order to support the underdeveloped countries. The campaign fund is going to be used to provide clean water and education to Kenyan children.



